Discharge instructions for skin procedure:

Dissolvable/Absorbable Sutures:

- Your wound closure has been performed today with small buried/dissolvable sutures. Steritapes have been applied over the wound at this time. A small bandage has been applied over the top of that.
- Remove outer bandage and leave the white Steritapes exposed and shower in 48 hours. No tub bath.
- At that point you can apply a bandage over the top or simply leave the Steritapes exposed. Somewhere between 3 and 10 days they will begin to come off. At that point any small exposed sutures can either be left open or covered with a small bandage/band aid.

Skin Surface Sutures:

- Your wound closure has been performed today with skin sutures placed on the skin surface. A Band-Aid or small bandage has been applied over the top of that.
- Remove the outer bandage and shower beginning in 24 or 48 hours. No tub bath.
- At that point you can leave the sutures exposed or you can choose to cover it with a small Band-Aid or bandage. DO NOT USE any topical antibiotic (Neosporin, bacitracin, triple antibiotic) or Vaseline or Aquaphor. We find it best to just LEAVE IT OPEN TO AIR.

Skin Graft Site:

Newark:

- Your wound closure has been performed today with skin graft. This means you have 2 surgical sites.
- The location of the cancer where the skin graft has been placed has a small yellow bandage sutured in place. Any additional bandage over the top of this can be removed after 24 to 48 hours however the yellow bandage must stay in place and MUST REMAIN DRY until seen in office.
- Oral antibiotics will be prescribed.
- Activity: No exercise or strenuous work until cleared by the office.
- Elevation: Elevate head, arm, leg as much as possible.
- **Leg Surgery**: It is extremely important to limit time up on your feet, elevate leg as much as possible, significantly limit your activity to limit swelling and help healing.
- Anesthesia: Local anesthesia normally wears off in 1-2 hours but may last up to 8 hours.
- **Diet**: Eat normally, do not drink alcohol for 24 hours after procedure. If taking antibiotic, take with food.
- **Bleeding**: Apply firm continuous pressure over the bandage. This may take up to 20 minutes to stop. For excessive bleeding call our office at 302-866-7546; for dizziness or vomiting/passing out call **911**.
- **Pain**: Discomfort is expected. You can ice the area for 20 minutes each hour. Over the counter Tylenol and ibuprofen (Advil/Motrin) or Aspirin can be taken.
- Concerns: If your wound becomes red, warm, painful or has drainage or you experience a fever of 101 degrees or greater please contact the doctor. Also, for any questions please contact the office.
- Smoking: Please refrain from smoking as this adversely affects your healing ability.
